Trial Court judgment was against Glendale in the matter of the work solicitation Ordinance. Change the Ordinance and pay the plaintiff’s attorney fees of \$65,000. (As of this time we have no idea the cost to the taxpayers.) The City Attorney wrote the Ordinance that the Federal District Court found unconstitutional. The City Attorney spent more money on drafting the ordinance and defending it in Court than all the public records requests cost in the last 10 years. The City responded with an appeal. Plaintiff and City worked out a settlement that included a change in the Ordinance and dropping of the Plaintiff’s fees. **Outcome:** City Council passed the amendment and the City will save \$65,000.

Housing growth in Glendale from June 1, 2007 through May 30, 2008 shows a net gain of 4 Single Family Dwellings, 136 Multiple Family Units and 68 low/very low income housing units According to 2008 Congestion Management Program Self-certification process

There was a [public hearing](#) on July 29 for new fees and increased fees. Among those fees was a new one for annual fire inspections of buildings up to 75 feet tall. There are approximately 5500 apartment buildings that fall into that category or a windfall of \$2,000,000. Reading the materials didn’t indicate an exemption for single family residences. Should the City want more money, they could raise up to \$14,000,000 or \$30 per month per SFR dwelling.

From approved fee schedule: 15. Low-Rise & Mid-Rise. To maintain or operate a low-rise or mid-rise building with Health and Safety Code. Section 13217. Permit fee for low-rise or mid-rise..... \$360.00 (Includes up to two hour of inspection time. additional time computed at the rate of \$120.00 per hour)

The State Law covers only high rise buildings. Not an undefined Low-Rise and Mid-Rise. The State defines High-Rise as 75 feet tall or more and does exempt buildings with 12 dwellings or less. Looks like the attempt to grab money overcame the State law. **Here are just a couple of little things...one design review fee went up 75% from \$399-\$700. There is a new \$360 minimum inspection fee for buildings less than 75 feet in height. Does that include SFRs? The language is vague. The public hearing is over and the Council agreed to future fee increases without their input.**

100K Club of Davis

One of the striking features of the 100K Club of Davis is that the city employee who earned the most money last year was not City Manager Bill Emlen but rather Fire Captain Richard Moore on the strength of over \$77,000 in overtime wages. The only other non-public safety official in the top 10 was Parks and Community Services Director Donna Silva. In all there are 61 members of the 100K Club of Davis from 2007, with 48 of those being public safety employees. Of those 38 were firefighters.

Nine well meaning people took me to task during a City Council meeting for various things such as abusing the Brown Act by speaking on many issues at Council meetings taking up valuable time that could be used for other things; abusing my Constitutional Rights by requesting public records at a great cost to the taxpayers. Further that I was suing the City over the Brown Act; that Herbert Molano is connected with Vanguardians...any opinion, innuendo or self-serving indictment to muzzle the watchdog. I am sharing my thoughts with you as many more than 9 people have contacted me to tell me they support Vanguardians' Mission and Vision and asking me not to quit even though they feel and some have 'proof' of who planned this well orchestrated attempt to quell advocacy in the City. Some of the 9 also made the accusation that the letters and calls in Vanguard are made up because they aren't signed.

Setting the record straight...the City Attorney acquires no additional cost in the operation of that Department whether or not there are requests for public documents. Has the City conducted a study on why it requires 8-10 signoffs on a report when just a few years ago it took only 4? I checked County Court records and found there was no lawsuit between Vanguardians and CoG. There are many people in Glendale that feel threatened by City Government. They have chosen to contribute their thoughts and opinions as long as they can do so with anonymity. Patrick Masihi and Lenore Solis spoke out against 'City policy' and were removed from their appointive posts. Need more be said?

Neither the City Council nor City Management wants to own up to the fact that expenses caused by a burgeoning payroll and post employment costs are growing much faster than revenue. None of those nine people showed up for a public hearing on fee increases that may affect many of the businesses and homeowners (lack of a proper definition co-existent with State law). Vanguard of Davis: [Vanguard Report: City of Davis Employee Salaries Rise Far Faster Than Tax Revenue](#)

Through a public records request to the City of Davis, the Vanguard has obtained data that show from fiscal year 2000-01 through 2007-08 that city employee salaries rose far faster than the city's tax revenue. Total compensation to city employees rose from just over \$27 million in 2000-01 to just under \$50 million in 2007-08, which is an increase of \$21.7 million over an eight year period. At the same time, tax revenues only increased by \$6.2 million from \$18.3 million to \$25.2 million. This finding has major implication for both future growth and city taxes. Davis' CM only gets 160K, only 61 100K employees, only \$7.2M; pop of 65K; the interesting stat in Davis 48 of the 61 100K employees are police and fire, of which 38 of the 48 are fire.

Barry Allen's statement to City Council on August 5, 2008 – "I am very disappointed in our Mayor who attacked me last week as the messenger bringing forth an article in the Pasadena Weekly.

I relied on the veracity of an adjudicated newspaper not known for publishing statements attributed to the wrong person – today I request the Mayor and this Council place on the agenda the censure of Council member Weaver for making public the statements in the Pasadena Weekly that have caused Glendale the anger and frustration that comes from the ethnic divide that is being experienced.

Rather than face down Mr. Weaver the Mayor has chosen to eviscerate me, cut out my innards, along with the people at the PW. Is that what a Mayor does, 'eviscerate' people? Mayor Drayman wrote to the Glendale Family Jewels Blog and to Hal Weber's Opengovernment website calling me and an unidentified City Council member Weasel's and Rodents.

According to his ballot statement Drayman is quoted, "As citizens of Glendale, we share a common stake in our city, its future and how it is represented. Local government is meant to be our most available form of representation, yet our city government has become increasingly remote, increasingly politicized and increasingly dismissive of its own constituency. ... As your elected council member, representing the interests of ordinary citizens will be my first priority, and I pledge that all matters of public advocacy, economic development and the allocation of municipal resources shall flow from that priority."

When the tough decisions came before Mr. Drayman he abstained from voting; he picked up his City Hall office and moved back to Montrose and now he calls people names and works to denigrate them, put down their achievements and disembowel them.

Mayor Drayman, instead of pretending to be a leader, has decided he will attack everyone that disagrees with him. Mayor Drayman owes this community an apology. I want to make clear that it takes no backbone to simply make outrageous comments, accusations and half truths which injure people and their good works.

I expect an apology from Mayor Drayman for his failure to support public advocacy and using his position as a bullying pulpit to castigate, chastise and attempt to disenfranchise those that do not always agree with him. I know that an apology from Mayor Drayman will not be forthcoming. That is on him.

Mr. Mayor, you have exchanged certain confidences with me. I want you to know I will continue to honor my commitment. "

BONDS

Here is a question you should ask the Council and those candidates for election to the Council: How will you pay off the \$492,000,000 debt? The interest on that debt is about \$500,000,000. As you read earlier, the investment has lost money; the City is spending more than it takes in.

Not one word has been uttered about cutting expenses – in fact, on Tuesday evening Council is being asked to fund another \$100K administrative position because the people assigned to the budget task aren't doing their job. An issue that shows the City Manager isn't doing his. It is time for the Council to make Management changes.

The solution is not to stop development as that is paying the exorbitant payroll. Impact fees and TIF will provide for parks and libraries.

You elect the Council speak up and speak out. Tell them you want fiscal accountability. Next year Fire Union Contracts are up. One CCM has already accepted \$2,500 from them!
